Family of Missing Woman Still Holds Out Hope

The family of Heather Riggio Joins Forces with the CUE Center for Missing Persons

Wilmington, NC – The family of missing Florida woman continues to hold out hope that their loved one will be found one day and recently has contacted a non profit national organization located in Wilmington, NC which provides services free to families who suffer the lost of a missing loved one, with a plea for help.

Heather Riggio was visiting a relative in North Miami Beach, Florida. She was last seen leaving that residence on May 06, 2007 and getting into a white, SUV type vehicle, driven by an older male; she has not been seen or heard from since. “I am sicken daily by the not knowing of where my granddaughter is and as time passes, it seems people have forgotten, we cannot forget” said Sybil Chierico.

Since Heather’s disappearance her family has made ever attempt to keep her name and face out in the public, but have run out of ideas and energy, so in their search for help they found and then contacted the CUE Center less than three months ago.

“We immediately featured Heather on our national road tour telling her story in eleven states and making people aware of her, surprisingly many had no knowledge of her case, said CUE Founder, Monica Caison. The tour called “On The Road to Remember” features cold cases annually of missing persons and this year traveled close to 3,000 miles leaving a trail of DVD, press kits, t-shirts, flyers, bumper stickers and visiting over twenty host rally stops which involved the media at all levels; all to remind communities of the 109 unsolved cases featured on this year’s tour line up.

Tipsters can remain anonymous and can leave confidential information by clicking the form on her site. Visitors can also download a poster from her site and help by getting involved.

In addition, Heather Riggio's story and photo is currently featured on the website for the TV show "Americas Most Wanted", http://www.amw.com/missing_persons all in an effort seek new information to aid law officials in the investigation." In missing person cases that this amount of time has passed without locating the individual, we must start over in the awareness effort, to gain new information and ultimately locate a new area to search", said Mrs. Caison. All searches conducted for the missing are to successfully eliminate space, knowing where the person is not and hoping to eventually get to the right place", she added.
